# **EVACUATION PROCEDURES**

- Voluntary (No Reimbursement)
- Recommended (No Reimbursement)
- Mandatory (Reimbursable)
- Wing Commander will give the order to Evacuate
- Safe Haven locations/distance will be announced

\*\*\* "ALL CLEAR" is not official termination of evacuation\*\*\*



# **EVACUATION ENTITLEMENTS**

- Use of Government Travel Card (GTC) is Authorized
- Advances available for members who do not have a GTC
- Entitlements are effective the date of evacuation order given and cease on the date evacuation is terminated
- All evacuated (military, dependents, civilians) receive:
  - Mileage \$.57/mile per vehicle (Within a pre-determined distance)
  - Lodging (Reimbursed based on Safe Haven Location)
  - Daily Meal Rate

# **DAILY MEAL RATE**

- Reimbursed based on rate at the safe haven location
- First and last day of travel, 75% of rate will be paid
- Dependents over age 12 receive 100% of members rate
- Dependents age 12 and under receive 50% of members rate

# **Family Preparedness**

Have a 72 hr bag with emergency supplies, tailored to your family's needs:

- Water 1 gal per person per day
- **Food** non-perishable items
- First Aid Kit
- Radio
- Hygiene items
- Medications
- Flashlight
- Can Opener
- Extra batteries

Don't forget to have an Emergency Kit for your pet. Do NOT leave pets behind during a mandatory evacuation.
