<b>HURCON 5</b>	Destructive winds are possible within 96 hours.
<b>HURCON 4</b>	Destructive winds are possible within 72 hours.
<b>HURCON 3</b>	Destructive winds are possible within 48 hours.
<b>HURCON 2</b>	Destructive winds are possible within 24 hours
<b>HURCON 1</b>	Destructive winds are possible within 12 hours
<b>HURCON 1C</b>	Caution: Winds of 40-57 mph sustained are occurring.
<b>HURCON 1E</b>	Emergency: Winds of 58 mph sustained and/or gusts of 69 mph or greater are occurring.
<b>HURCON 1R</b>	Recovery: Destructive winds have subsided and are no longer forecast to occur.

<b>Category 1</b>	74-95 mph	Base shelters are open to personnel who wish to evacuate their homes.
<b>Category 2</b>	96-110 mph	Installation Commander may direct a mandatory evacuation of all personnel south of Highway 98.
<b>Category 3</b>	111-129 mph	Installation Commander may direct a mandatory evacuation of all personnel-regardless of their residential location.
<b>Category 4</b>	130-156 mph	Installation Commander may direct a mandatory evacuation of all non-essential personnel.
<b>Category 5</b>	157 or higher mph	Installation Commander may direct a mandatory evacuation of all non-essential personnel.

***Hurricane Condition (HURCON) is an alert scale used by the United States Armed Forces in the North Atlantic and the North Pacific to indicate the state of emergency or preparedness.***

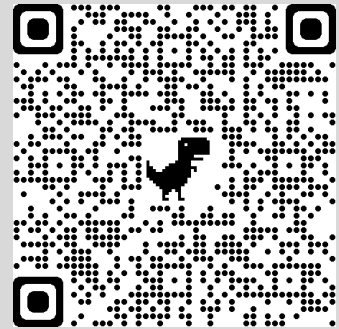

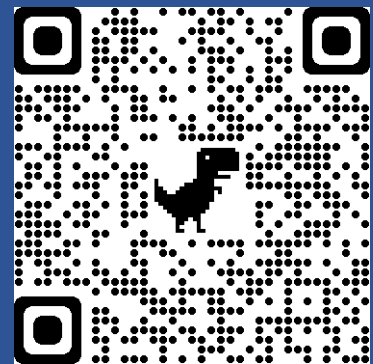
